- 1. Title of the practice: Add on Course: Data analysis using SPSS
- 2. **Objectives of the Practice**: Data science is a crucial field that plays a significant role in various industries, including business, healthcare, education, sports and many more. Best Practice 2

1. Title of the Programme: 'LIKHATU SAMSKRITAM' (Write Sanskrit)

- 2. **Objectives of the Project**: The main objectives of the Practice may be mentioned below:
 - To popularise Sanskrit language and Sanskrit Culture
 - To bring awareness among the people that Sanskrit is not too difficult to learn.
 - To make people aware of the fact that most of the words used in Assamese language are derived from Sanskrit
 - To create awareness about the fact that Sanskrit is not a foreign language, rather it is the foundation of most of the regional languages of India.

3. The context: It is true that all the regional languages have been originated from Sanskrit. But lack of practice has created many misconceptions about Sanskrit. Some of the challenges issues that needed to be addressed through this practice may be mentioned below:

- One of the allegations against Sanskrit is that it is too difficult to learn. Through this Practice an initiative has been made to wipe out the wrong notion by writing a few simple Sanskrit words in alphabetical order, along with Assamese words and its meaning and it has been shown that in both the languages the same words are used.
- Many people possess the wrong notion that like a foreign language Sanskrit has no connection with regional languages. Therefore, this has been designed to address the problem by creating an awareness that most of the words used in our regional languages, especially in Assamese language are of Sanskrit origin.

4. The Practice:

- Most of the words used in various regional languages in India have their root in Sanskrit. It is very important to understand the root of the words and it is not possible if we do not have any idea about the Sanskrit language. Considering the importance of the fact this practice has been launched by the Department of Sanskrit, B.N. College, Dhubri.
- Through this practice 'Likhatu Samskritam', an initiative has been taken to write the Sanskrit words in an alphabetic ORDER. The Assamese version of the Sanskrit words along with Assamese meanings have been produced on the sheet to make people understand that most of the Assamese words they use have their root in Sanskrit.
- The sheet has been produced before the people by the students of the Department. The person who has written on the sheet have also given their feedback.

The uniqueness of the practice in the context of Indian Higher Education:

- The students undertaking Higher education should know the proper use of words to improve their power of vocabulary, speaking and writing skills. As Assamese is the standard language of Assam, a comparative study of this language has been made with Sanskrit.
- It gives a solid foundation to the mother tongue of the students.
- To know the multi-linguistic pattern of the culture of India, learning of Sanskrit in a simplified manner is very essential for the students undertaking Higher Education.

5. Evidence of Success: The success of this practice may be mentioned below:

- The sheets of papers have been circulated among a few people and majority of the respondents have given a positive response.
- The persons who wrote on the papers, gave their response that this is one of the best practices to popularise Sanskrit language as well as Sanskrit culture.
