6. Governance, Leadership and Management

6.1 State the Vision and Mission of the institution

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The curriculum of the UG classes is prepared by the affiliating university (Gauhati University). However, a few faculties are the member of the committee of Course of Studies (CCS) of Gauhati University, who participated during the respective meetings and contributed to the development and modification of the syllabus and curriculum.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- The faculties prepare their Teaching Plans and submit the same to the IQAC within 10 days of the commencement of a semester.
- The faculties submit their Monthly Performance Report to the IQAC in the first week of every month.
- The principal of the college with the help of IQAC compares the Teaching Plans and the Monthly Performance Report of a particular teacher, and if necessary, discusses the matter in the Academic council (comprising all HODs).
- Teachers are encouraged to use ICT as their teaching aids to make their classes more interesting and effective. For this, the college provides necessary infrastructure, namely, PC, laptop, LCD projectors, smart board, etc. to the departments.
- Many teachers prepare the study materials and distribute the same to the students.
- Feedbacks from the students on the performance of the faculty are collected and analyzed. The same is placed before the Academic Council for necessary action.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

- The college conducts the end semester examinations as per schedule of the affiliating university.
- The college administration takes all the necessary steps for fair examinations.
- The college has been regularly chosen as the Spot Evaluation Zone by the Gauhati University. The college teachers evaluate the scripts as required.
- The college conducts sessional examinations for continuous evaluation.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- The faculties are encouraged to avail Teacher Fellowship under FIP of UGC to pursue the research activities.
- The college makes available a good number of research journals and related materials in the central library.
- The college also encourages the faculties to participate in various seminars/conferences/workshops etc. Where they can exchange their views with the peers on the frontier knowledge.
- The Research committee of the college helps the teachers who want to apply for projects to various funding agencies, viz., UGC, DST, DBT, CSIR etc. The committee provides all necessary infrastructures (including laboratory, internet, Xerox machine etc.) to the teachers who undertake research project.
- The college publishes two peer reviewed Research Journals (One for Science and another for Humanities and Social Sciences).

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- A new room has been constructed to accommodate the IQAC of the college.
- Drainage and Internal roads of the college have been improved.
- The College Canteen has been renovated.
- Some more Library books have been procured.
- A Reading Room with a seating capacity of 80 students at a time has been constructed.
- Two large classrooms and two new departments have been constructed.
- A PG laboratory for Chemistry department has been set up.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- The college authority encourages the faculties to pursue research works that help them to update in the frontier area of knowledge.

**REPORT ON ANSWERS RECEIVED FROM THE STUDENTS OF B. N. COLLEGE,
DHUBRI FOR THE SESSION 2016..-2017**

INTRODUCTION:

Student feedback was taken from the students of science, arts and commerce stream for the academic session 2016 – 2017. Data were collected from 278 students (6th semester major/general students) regarding various parameters.

OBJECTIVE OF THE STUDENT FEEDBACK:

The main objective of the study was to know about the following parameters and to improve / arrangement of them on the basis of the response or answers received from the students.

The following points were included in the student feedback form:

1. To study the extent of coverage of course
2. To study the applicability /relevance to real life situation
3. To study the following points /parameters on teachers
 - (a) Regularity in taking classes, (b) Knowledge base, (c) Communication skill (d) Preparation for the class, (e) Sincerity/commitment (f) Accessibility in and outside the class etc.
4. To study the overall view of the student on the basis of the following points/
parameters
 - (a) The syllabus of each course
 - (b) How much of the syllabus was covered in the class
 - (c) Subjects offered by the college
 - (d) How far the unit test help to improve their studies
 - (e) About the library service provided by the college
 - (f) Availability of library resources
 - (g) Service provided by the college office
 - (h) Comment on drinking water and toilet facility provided by the college
 - (i) Facilities for extra-curricular activities
 - (j) To know about the teacher-student relationship

METHODOLOGY

The study was conducted by using questionnaire method. For this purpose a questionnaire was prepared including the points mentioned in the objectives of the study. There were 278 students from which feedback were taken.

The data so collected were properly scrutinized and very careful statistical analysis of the survey is made.

FINDINGS AND CONCLUSIONS:

The first question included in the questionnaire was about the extent of coverage of course. It is observed that 29.88% students remarked as very good regarding extent of coverage of course. 41.40% students answered as good, 18.36% answered as satisfactory and 7.20% of the students remarked as unsatisfactory.

Regarding the question on applicability / relevance to real life situation 225.92% students remarked as very good ,46.44% of students replied as good,20.16% students remarked as satisfactory and 5.40% of the students remarked as unsatisfactory .

Regarding the question on learning value of the course content 32.76% students replied as very good, 43.20% remarked as satisfactory. 18.00% students remarked as good and 3.24% of the students remarked as unsatisfactory.

Regarding the question on over all rating 27.00% students replied as very good, 44.28% remarked as satisfactory. 19.80% students remarked as good and 6.12% of the students remarked as unsatisfactory

FEED BACK ON TEACHERS:

The answer received from students regarding teacher on various parameters mention in the objectives of the study is given in a separate chart (i.e. TABLE NO-2)

OVERALL EVALUATION OF THE COLLEGE:

Some questions were included in the questionnaire to know about fruitfulness of unit test, syllabus, library facility etc. provided to the students by the college authority.

A question was put regarding the syllabus of each course. Although the syllabus is different for different subjects, yet an average 14.04% students answered that the syllabus of the course is adequate, 9.36% answered as inadequate, 7.20% told as challenging and only 1.44% of the student answered as dull.

Regarding the question on how much of the syllabus was covered in the class, 25.20% students answered that 85-100% syllabus was covered in the class, 42.84% answered that syllabus was covered 70-80 %. 14.40% informed that syllabus was covered 55-70% whereas 6.84% students informed that less than 55% was covered.

18.36% students informed that the subjects offered by the college is more than adequate, 52.20% students answered as adequate, 16.20% students answered as inadequate and only 5.40% of the students answered as poor. A question was put to the students regarding unit test held in our college. 39.60% students reported that unit test held were always fair, 27.00% replied as sometimes fair, 10.80% replied as sometimes unfair and only 3.24% of the students answered as usually unfair. 38.16% students replied that unit test is very effective to improve their studies. 33.48% replied as effective. 14.76% as sometimes effective and only 5.04% replied as ineffective.

Regarding teacher-student relationship 36.36% students replied as the relationship is very good. 31.68% replied as good ,15.48% as satisfactory and only 6.12% replied as unsatisfactory.

A question was put to students about library service provided by the college. 21.60% students remarked that library service provided by the college as very good. 37.44% students remarked as good and 18.36% remarked as satisfactory and 10.44% students remarked as unsatisfactory. On the other hand 16.56% students remarked that availability of library resources as adequate.44.64% students remarked as more than adequate. 16.92% students remarked that availability of library resources as inadequate and 9.36% remarked as poor.

Regarding the question about service provided by the college office15.84% answered as very good, 35.28% answered as good, 25.92% remarked as satisfactory and 15.84% remarked as unsatisfactory.

Only 13.32% of the students remarked that drinking water and toilet facility provided by the college is more than adequate. 42.84% of students remarked as adequate, 18.36% remarked as inadequate and 13.32% remarked as poor. Lastly a question on facilities for extra-curricular activities was put in the questionnaire. It is seen that 11.88% students remarked as very good. 41.76% students remarked as good.23.04% students remarked about the extra-curricular facilities as satisfactory, on the other hand 6.48% students remarked as unsatisfactory.

BEST PRACTICES: 2016-17

1. MENTORING

Objective of the practice:

The college has observed that the dropout rate of the college in the sessions 2014-15 and 2015-16 has been a little high. The college has noted it seriously and tried to find out the cause or causes of the same. Accordingly different initiatives have been taken. One such initiative is mentoring of the students.

The process:

The students of college are divided into several groups, each group consisting of about 25 students. Each group is allotted a teacher as the mentor. The mentors keep in touch with the students and encourage the students to share their problems –both academic and non- academic. The teachers act as guide, friend and philosopher to the students. They keep in touch with the students and sit with them at least once a month. In the process they come to know about the students' different difficulties faced by them, which might lead to the discontinuation of their studies. The teachers have come up with different causes for dropout such as economic hardships, early marriage, etc.

Impact of the Practice:

The college has taken some steps to overcome the difficulties of the students. Students securing 80% and above are given free studentship and provided hostel facilities. The students facing economic hardship are provided with books from the Book Bank of the Central Library. The students who suffer from psychological problems are counselled. And consequently the rate of dropout has come down.

BEST PRACTICES: 2016-17

2. SATURDAY SEMINAR OF THE FACULTIES

Objective of the Practice:

The very objective of the practice is to create an atmosphere of research in the institution. The present day higher educational institutions have to focus on teaching-learning and research with equal emphasis. But the institutions may not receive sufficient fund from the funding agencies like UGC, DST etc. to carryout research projects or organize National or International Seminars. So, the faculty members of the college have decided to prepare research papers and organize seminars among themselves.

The Process:

It has been decided by the faculty members that three or four among them will present their papers last Saturday of every month. The names of the paper presenters are generally announced two months ahead of the seminar. The faculty members participate and interact with the paper presenter.

Impact of the Practice:

A good number of research papers have been written and presented in the Saturday seminars. Many faculty members have developed interest in research related activities. A research atmosphere has grown in the college.
